The overall goal of the Bridges Coordinator is to ensure that all Aboriginal children in care are connected to their Aboriginal families and communities, culture and heritage by:

- Encouraging and assisting Aboriginal communities in reconnecting and reclaiming their children and youth who are in the care of MCFD
- Nurturing a sense of belonging for Aboriginal children in care, a sense that they are part of and connected to their birth and extended family, Aboriginal community, culture and heritage
- Reviewing (MCFD Referred) child's current file to create personalized cultural plans and packages
- Providing cultural guidance for the project team working with selected children, families and community members
- Guiding team members to build on the capacity of aboriginal children, families and communities to assist in the planning of safe care options for children when necessary

- Minimum Grade 12 diploma and at least 3 years prior experience; preference for diploma/degree in health, education or social services field
